
The Holy Well, Bedmond

Earlier this year, members of the Abbots Langley Local History Society visited a Bedmond spring, anecdotally referred to as the "Holy Well", with the kind permission of the landowner. Now on private property, this location was originally part of the land of Breakspear Farm which was the birthplace of Nicholas Breakspear. He was born in about 1100 and in 1154 became the only English-born Pope (Pope Adrian IV).

Legend has it that the spring became a source of holy water with healing properties, especially for the eyes, and there is anecdotal evidence that religious pilgrims journeyed to Bedmond to visit this "Holy Well"

The Abbots Langley Local History Society are investigating this legend and have not yet found any witnesses or written proof that these visits to the Holy Well occurred,
